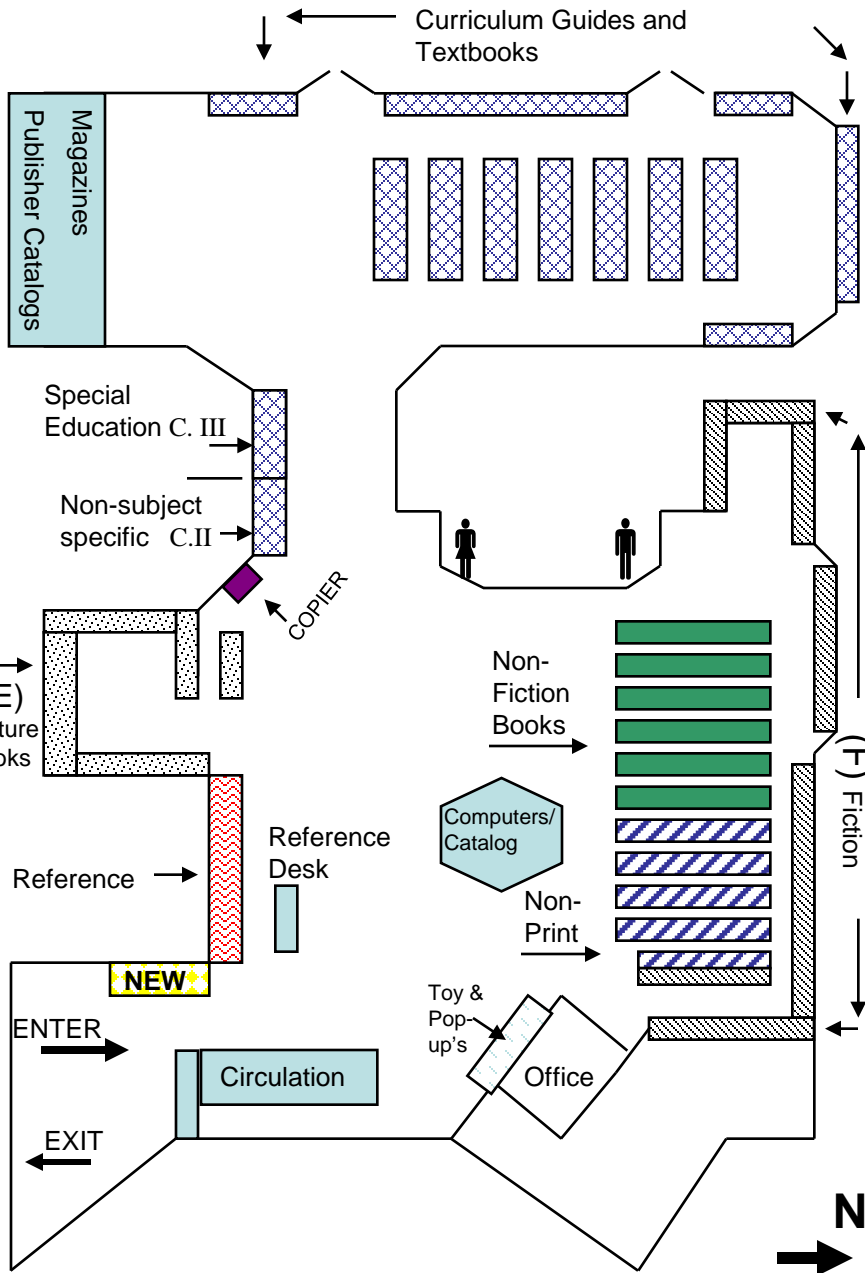

As of August, 2009, our collection includes 9,000 curriculum guides and textbooks, 2,800 non-print items and 45,000 children's and young adult books.
